Florida Finley Onion

Florida Finley Onions can be planted as soon as Labor Day. Then bulbs should be planted upright a few inches deep in the soil. Sometimes they lag at the beginning if extreme heat persists through September. They really hit their stride as fall temperatures set in and will begin rapidly multiplying. Once the plants begin to multiply, you can divide them up and replant. With determination, you can probably turn this package of bulbs or divisions into hundreds before next summer. You will now be your own supplier of planting bulbs. Around the beginning of May the plants will turn brown and die back. At this stage, dig the bulbs up and allow them to dry for a few weeks. The bulbs are stored over the summer indoors in a box.

These onions do best in the growing conditions of a vegetable garden with high soil fertility, regular water and good sun exposure.
