Grow Guide Okinawa Spinach

Okinawa Spinach cuttings root best with high humidity, warmth and dappled shade. As with all cuttings, a well draining but consistently moist media is crucial. These cuttings root at very high rates. We recommend rooting in small pots and transplanting out to the garden later.

Okinawa Spinach grows well in full sun to partial shade. It makes a great groundcover under newly planted trees and amongst other taller perennials. This is a very hardy plant but responds to fertility and water with bountiful growth. Every so often the plants begin to decline and cuttings need to be rooted for a new patch. Okinawa spinach is very sensitive to frost but can easily be protected by throwing a blanket over it on chilly nights. This variety is much more likely to return from the roots than longevity spinach on less brutal winters.
